Day 1 – Fri – Feb 26: DFW/TLV

Overnight flight from USA to Tel-Aviv.

Day 2 – Sat – Feb 27: Tel Aviv

Upon arrival at the airport meeting and assistance by Coral Travel & Tours representative inside the terminal. Transfer to your hotel in Tel-Aviv for dinner and overnight

Day 3 – Sun – Feb 28: Jaffa – Caesarea – Megiddo – Sea of Galilee

After our Israeli breakfast we start our day with a walking tour in the old city of **Jaffa**. Jaffa has been known in the bible as Joppa and is considered the world's oldest port and the place where the prophet Jonah set sail for Tarshish. Jaffa is associated with the deeds of Peter. After a short drive through Tel Aviv, travel via the Sharon plain to **Caesarea**. Caesarea was the seat of the Roman Procurator of the Judea in the time of Christ and the place Peter converted the centurion Cornelius. (Acts 10:24). Explore the Roman Theater and the aqueduct and view the ruins of Roman, Byzantine and Crusader times. Continue to **Mt. Carmel**, to the "**Mukhraka**" the site where Elijah challenged and defeated the 450 prophets of Baal (King 18:20). If time permits, drive via the ancient "Way of the Sea" to **Megiddo**, the fortress city of King Solomon, later built upon by King Ahab. The books of Daniel and Revelation will come alive as

we study about the final Battle of Armageddon (Revelation 16: 14-19) while viewing the Plains of Jezreel. Drive to Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee passing Nazareth and Cana on the way. Dinner and overnight: Kibbutz Guest House at the Sea of Galilee

Day 4 – Mon – Mar 1: Caesarea Philippi – Sea of Galilee – Golan Heights

The day starts with a drive to the **Mt. of Beatitudes**, site of the Sermon on the Mount. Drive along the Hula Valley to **Tel Dan** and visit the remains of the city. On to **Caesarea Philippi**, where Peter made his confession of faith to Jesus. Via a ride through the Golan Heights we will return to the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee, the area where Jesus spent his years of ministry. See the ruins of **Capernaum**, the town where Jesus made his home after leaving Nazareth. View the remains of the ancient synagogue in which he may have preached and the house of Peter. On to **Tabgha** where the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes took place. Drive to **Kibbutz Ginossar** and visit "**Jesus Boat**". Enjoy a traditional St. Peter Fish dinner. Overnight: Kibbutz Guest House.

Day 5 - Tue - Mar 2: The Jordan Valley - Nazareth - Bet She'an - Jerusalem

Start the day at **Yardenit**, the baptismal center site on the Jordan River. We will have morning worship and prayers. Continue with a **boat ride on the Sea of Galilee**. Drive through the city of **Cana**, where Jesus performed his first miracle: turning jars of water into wine. Continue to **Nazareth** and the Synagogue. Visit the Springs of Gideon where the final 300 soldiers were chosen. Drive to the ancient city of **Bet She'an**. Continue to Jerusalem via Wady Kelt. Enter Jerusalem as pilgrim and view the city from Mt. Scopus. Dinner and overnight: Hotel in Jerusalem

Day 6 - Wed - Mar 3: Jerusalem

After breakfast we'll ascend the **Mt. of Olives** for a breathtaking panoramic view of the old city of Jerusalem. Visit **Dominus Flevit**. Walk along the Palm Sunday way. Descend to the **Garden of Gethsemane** where Jesus spent the last night before he was arrested. Visit the **Church of All Nations**. Walk along the "Last Way" to Mt. Zion. Cross the Kidron Valley and see the **Tombs of Absalom, Zachary and James**. Stand next to the **Southern Wall** and view the City of David. Drive to **Mt. Zion** and visit the House of the High Priest Caiphas. Visit the **Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu**. This is the Place where St. Peter denied his Lord 3 times. On to the **Last Supper Room**

and **King David's Tomb**. Visit and pray at the **Western Wall**. Dinner and overnight: Hotel in Jerusalem.

Day 7 - Thu - Mar 4: Massada

After an early breakfast depart Jerusalem, and travel east to the shores of the Dead Sea, the lowest place on earth. Drive along the shores of the Dead Sea to **Massada**. Ascend Massada by cable car. Massada is the site of the most dramatic act in Jewish history. Explore the ancient excavation of Herod's Palaces, the bathhouse, the store-rooms, the ramp and the oldest synagogue in the world. Visit **Ein Gedi** and **Qumran**, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Have devotions in the wilderness. Continue to the shore for a "float" on the **Dead Sea**. Return to Jerusalem. Afternoon at leisure. Dinner and overnight: Hotel in Jerusalem

Day 8 - Fri - Mar 5: Jerusalem

This morning visit the **Menorah**, the symbol of Israel next to the Knesset, the Israeli Parliament. Proceed to the **Israel Museum** where you will see the Holy Land walk around model of the City of Jerusalem as it was in the Second Temple period (the time of Jesus) and the shrine of the Book where the Dead Sea Scrolls are kept. Continue to **Yad Vashem**, the national Holocaust Museum. In the afternoon drive to **Bet Shemesh** and the **Ella Valley**, the site where David

Fought Goliath. We will continue our journey to **Abu Gosh**, where the Ark of the Covenant rested 20 years. Return to Jerusalem. Dinner and overnight: Hotel in Jerusalem

Day 9 - Sat - Mar 6: Jerusalem

After breakfast drive to **Mt Moriah** (Luke 2:46-48, John, 8:1-11, Mark 13:1-2, Matthew 27:51). Walk up to the **Temple Place** and view the area of the **Dome of the Rock** and the **El Aqsa Mosque**. Today we will also visit **St. Anne's Church**, a fine example of Crusader architecture and the **Pools of Bethesda**. Visit the **Israel Museum** which hosts the **Shrine of the Book** (where some of the Dead Sea Scrolls are kept) and the **Holy Land Model** from the 2nd Temple. Continue to **Yad Vashem**, the Holocaust Museum. End the day at the **Garden Tomb**. In the evening Farewell dinner. Late check out from hotel. Transfer to the airport for your flight back to the USA.

Day 10 - Sun - Mar 7: Tel Aviv - USA

Overnight flight back to the USA. Arrive the same day.
